Support spacing for cable trays must align with the manufacturer's instructions, as outlined in NEC 392.30 (A). Generally, standard trays require supports every 6 to 10 feet, while ...

Normal Spans: These trays must have support after every 2 or 3 meters. This will involve purchasing additional hangers and wasting more time drilling holes in the ceiling.

Where the ladder cable tray supports small diameter multiconductor control and instrumentation cables; 6, 9, or 12 inch rung spacings should be specified.
