

# How long can a junction box last

BS 5733 defines a maintenance free accessory as: "An accessory which does not require further inspection, testing or maintenance after installation in a circuit, and which incorporates screwless ...

If the box opening is less than 8 inches in any direction, each wire must stick out at least 3 inches from the box opening. This extra length helps you make safe and easy connections.

If you're in there remaking the splice for pigtails, the wire you start with can be short and your working with wires that barely long enough to themselves come out of the box.

Junction boxes are opened far more often than many other components. Gasket durability, fastener quality and internal clarity all affect how safe and efficient maintenance work will be.
