

How to coil a ribbon-like pigtail

Mass fusion splicing can fuse up to all 12 fibers in one ribbon at once. Mass Fusion Pigtails come with all 12 fibers terminated and a ribbonized open end. Entire ribbons can be spliced simultaneously.

Using this technique will allow you to neatly coil even the most stubbornly twist-resistant cords. Plus, there's no twist built up in the cord so that when you uncoil it, it won't tangle as easily.
