Safe stacking refers to the proper organization and placement of materials in a warehouse to prevent injuries, product damage, and compliance violations. Effective stacking in ...

(1) Material stored inside buildings under construction shall not be placed within 6 feet of any hoistway or inside floor openings, nor within 10 feet of an exterior wall which does not extend ...

According to 29 CFR 1910.176 (b), storage of materials shall not create a hazard. This means all bags, containers, bundles and pallets stored in tiers must be properly secured.

Items that cannot be securely stacked should be stored in a manner that prevents them from becoming projectiles. Use netting or other containment methods to secure loose items, particularly in high ...

All boxed materials should be banded, cross-tied with plastic fibers, or stretch-wrapped to remain stable. If possible, you should stack boxes of similar size and weight together. OSHA's ...

Materials shall not be stored on scaffolds or runways in excess of supplies needed for immediate operations.
