

Remove the tail fiber

Dehairing, or Fiber Separation removes the coarser hair fibers and vegetation from the fleece. It works best with camelid fibers (camel, alpaca, llama, etc), as well as Cashmere, Pygora, bison, and yak.

Pigtails can be generally understood as two pigtails when the jumper is cut from the middle. Only one end of the pigtail has a connector, and the other end is a broken end of the fiber optic cable ...
